TYSER, C.J. In this case it is not necessary to go so far, for I believe it to be a BERTRAM principle of universal application, that when the subject of a country sues a foreigner resident in the country in a "transitory" action, J. the Courts of the country will entertain the action and it is no answer HARALAMBO for the foreigner to say that, though he is for the time being resident AUXENTIOS in the country, his place of business is abroad. As to the meaning of "resides" in Order II, rule 2, that has already been decided in Mouzouri v. Kissonerghi.
