and mosque in the village or group of villages, or, should there be no church or mosque, in some conspicuous place in the village. Any person who shall gather carobs before the date so fixed shall be liable to pay a fine not exceeding five pounds, or to imprisonment for a period not exceeding one month.

Rules.

84.--(1.) The High Commissioner in Council may make Rules prescribing procedure and forms to be used under this Law, and generally for carrying this Law into effect.

(2.) The High Commissioner, with the assistance and advice of the Chief Justice, may make Rules of Court for the purposes of this Law.

85. This Law may be cited as the Police Law, 1878.

# POLIS TES KHRYSOKHOU WATER.

## 14 OF 1900.

TO PROVIDE A PROPER SUPPLY OF WATER FOR THE USE OF THE TOWN OF POLIS TES KHRYSOKHOU.

Short title.

1. This Law may be cited as the Polis tes Khrysokhou Water Law, 1900.

Acquisition of spring "Fortini." 2. For the purpose of supplying the inhabitants of the Town of Polis tes Khrysokhou with water for drinking and domestic use, the Government may acquire under the provisions of the Land Acquisition Law, 1899, the exclusive right to take and use the water arising from the spring situate within the lands of the Village of Bellathusa and known as "Fortini."

Provided that the High Commissioner shall not sanction any scheme for the acquisition of the said water unless he is satisfied that proper provision is made by the scheme, or otherwise exists, for the supply of water for the drinking and domestic use of the inhabitants of the Village of Bellathusa and for their animals.

3. In the event of any dispute arising as to whether any person claiming an interest in the said water is lawfully entitled to such interest, it shall be lawful for the District Court of Papho on the application of the Commissioner of the District or of any interested person, and after due notice to all interested parties and hearing them if they appear, to determine whether such person is so interested, and the nature and extent of his interest, if any; and the decision of the District Court shall be appealable in like manner as if the decision were an ordinary judgment of the District Court relating to immovable property.

4. The compensation to be made to persons interested in the Compensa said water may be either by way of money payment or by reserving for their use some definite proportion of or share in the water.

5. Any future increase in the water arising from the said spring, Future whether it accrues naturally or by reason of any work carried out water. by the Government, or by or on behalf of the inhabitants of the Town of Polis tes Khrysokhou, shall be deemed to have been acquired for the purposes of this Law.
