BE it enacted:—

Short title.

1. This Law may be cited as the Village Authorities (Amendment) Law, 1930, and shall be read as one with the Village Authorities Law, 1923, (hereinafter referred to as the Principal Law), and the Village Authorities (Amendment) Law, 1928, and the Principal Law and the said Law and this Law may together be cited as the Village Authorities Laws, 1923 to 1930.

2. The Principal Law, section 14 (6), is hereby repealed and in place thereof the following sub-section shall have effect:—

(6) Subject to his obtaining a certificate from the Director of Land Registration and Surveys of his fitness for the duties of an auctioneer and to giving financial security to the satisfaction of the Director of Land Registration and Surveys, to conduct all sales on execution of immovable property in his village or quarter.

Provided that—

(a) When the owner of the immovable property to be sold belongs to the Christian community, the qualified Christian Mukhtar shall conduct the sale, and when the owner of the immovable property to be sold belongs to the Moslem community, the qualified Moslem Mukhtar shall conduct the sale;

(b) where there is no qualified Mukhtar in a village or quarter the sale shall be conducted by the qualified Christian or Moslem Mukhtar, as the case may be, of the nearest village or quarter in the district;

(c) where the qualified Christian or Moslem Mukhtar, as the case may be, in a village or quarter is ill or unavoidably absent from his village or quarter and is

thereby prevented from conducting a sale, such Mukhtar or the Aza appointed by him to perform his duties shall give notice in writing of such illness or absence to the qualified Christian or Moslem Mukhtar, as the case may be, of the nearest village or quarter in the district, who shall then conduct such sale at the time and place originally fixed therefor.

BE it enacted:—

1. This Law may be cited as the Newspaper, Books and Printing Presses Law, 1930. Short title.

2. In this Law:—

“Newspaper” means any paper containing public news, intelligence, or occurrences, or any remarks, observations or comments in relation to such news, intelligence or occurrences, printed for sale or free distribution and published in Cyprus periodically, or in parts or numbers. Interpre-
tation.

“Permit” means a permit granted by the Colonial Secretary under the provisions of this Law.

“Book” includes every volume, part or division of a volume, and pamphlet in any language, and every sheet of music, map, chart or plan separately printed or lithographed; but does not include any publication which consists merely of a price list, sale catalogue, annual report, trade circular or trade advertisement.
