Officer Administering the Government.

BE it enacted:—

1. This Law may be cited as the Dentists Registration (Amendment) Law, 1932, and shall be read as one with the Dentists Registration Law, 1926, (hereinafter called "the Principal Law"). Short title.

2. Section 4 of the Principal Law is hereby repealed and the following section substituted therefor:— New section substituted for section 4 of the Principal Law.

"Qualifications for registration.

4. Any person who is the holder of a licence, degree or diploma,

(a) granted in the United Kingdom or in any other country in Europe or in any British possession or self-governing Dominion or in the United States of America which would by law entitle the holder to practise dental surgery or dentistry in the country in which such licence, degree or diploma was granted, or

(b) granted in any other country by any University or School of Dentistry as may be prescribed by Order made by the Governor in Council,

shall, subject to the provisions of section 6, be entitled to be registered as a dentist:

Provided that where it is necessary under the law of the country in which such licence, degree or diploma is granted that a person in order to practise dental surgery or dentistry in such country, should be a subject or citizen of that country, it shall be sufficient for the purpose of this section if the licence, degree or diploma would entitle the holder to practise dental surgery or dentistry in the country in which such licence, degree or diploma was granted if he were a subject or citizen of that country."
