

(2) The audit under sub-section (1) shall include an examination of overdue debts, if any, and a valuation of the assets and liabilities of the society.

(3) The Registrar or any person authorized by general or special order in writing in this behalf by the Registrar shall at all times have access to all the books, accounts, papers, cash and securities of a society, and every officer of the society shall furnish such information in regard to the transactions and working of the society as the person making such inspection may require.

(4) Subject to the general directions and instructions of the Registrar, the Commissioner of the District in which the society is carrying on business shall be deemed to be a person authorized within the meaning of the preceding sub-section."

A LAW TO AMEND THE FOREIGN TRIBUNAL CITATION LAW, 1912.

BE it enacted:—

1. This Law may be cited as the Foreign Tribunal Citation (Amendment) Law, 1932, and shall be read as one with the Foreign Tribunal Citation Law, 1912, (hereinafter called "the Principal Law"). Short title.

2. The Principal Law is hereby amended by the insertion immediately after section 3 of the following section:— New section 3A inserted in the Principal Law.

"Procedure to be adopted where a Convention is in force.

3A. Where in any civil or commercial matter pending before a Court or Tribunal in any foreign country with which a Convention on that behalf has been or shall be made and applied to Cyprus a Request for service of any document on a person in Cyprus is received by the Chief Registrar of the Supreme Court from the Consular or other authority of such country the following procedure shall, subject to any special provisions contained in the Convention, be adopted:—

(1) The service shall be effected by the delivery of the original or a copy of the document as indicated in the Request and the copy of the translation to the party or person to be served in person by the agent of the process server appointed pursuant to section 3 (2) of this Law, provided that where the party or person to be served is a native of Cyprus a translation drawn up in the language of such person shall at the same time be served upon him.

(2) No Court fees shall be charged in respect of the service. The particulars of charges of the agent employed to effect service shall be submitted to the Chief Registrar of the Supreme Court who shall certify the amount properly payable in respect thereof.

(3) The Chief Registrar of the Supreme Court shall transmit to the Consular or other authority making the Request a certificate establishing the fact and the date of the service in person, or indicating the reasons for which it has not been possible to effect it, and at the same time shall notify to the said Consular or other authority the amount of the charges certified under paragraph (2) hereof."

BE it enacted:—

Short title.

1. This Law may be cited as the Police (Amendment, No. 2) Law, 1932, and shall be read as one with the Police Laws, 1878 to 1929, (hereinafter called "the Principal Law"), and the Principal Law and this Law may together be cited as the Police Laws, 1878 to 1932.

2. Section 23 of the Principal Law is hereby amended by the deletion of the words "for drunkenness".

3. Section 24 of the Principal Law is hereby repealed.
