THE STATUTE LAWS OF CYPRUS

No. 2 OF 1940.

A LAW TO LEVY AN EXPORT DUTY OF CUSTOMS
UPON CERTAIN GOODS.

BE it enacted by His Excellency the Governor and
Commander-in-Chief of the Colony of Cyprus as
follows :—

1. This Law may be cited as the Customs (Export Duty) Short title.

2. In this Law—

“*ad valorem*” means the value of goods contained in a declaration made by the exporter of such goods under and in pursuance of the provisions of section 53 of the Customs Laws, 1936 to 1939;

“export duty” means the export duty levied, or which may be levied by the Governor in Council, under the provisions of this Law;

“goods” means all kinds of movable property and includes animals.

3. There shall be levied, collected and paid upon all goods which are specified in the Schedule and which shall be exported from the Colony an export duty at the rates set forth in the said Schedule.

4. The export duty shall be paid—

- (a) by or on behalf of the exporter of the goods;
- (b) before the exportation thereof; and
- (c) at the port or place of the exportation thereof.

5.—(1) The Governor in Council may by Order—

- (a) vary the Schedule or add to, or delete from, such Schedule any goods; and
- (b) fix the rates of export duty in respect of goods added to the Schedule; and
- (c) increase, reduce or cancel all or any of the rates of export duty—

(i) set forth in the Schedule, or

(ii) fixed in respect of goods added to the Schedule:

Provided that any rate of export duty fixed or increased by an Order made under this sub-section shall not in the aggregate be higher than ten per centum *ad valorem* in respect of any goods.

(2) Every Order made under the provisions of sub-section (1) shall be published in the *Gazette* and thereupon, and for so long as such Order subsists, the Schedule and the said Order shall be read and construed together.

6. Every person who—

(a) exports; or

(b) attempts to export; or

(c) knowingly aids or assists another person to export or to attempt to export,

goods upon which or in respect of which export duty has not been paid, shall be guilty of an offence:

Penalty: One hundred pounds and in addition the goods concerned shall be forfeited.

7. Section 60 of the Customs Law, 1936, as enacted in section 2 of the Customs (Amendment) Law, 1938, is hereby repealed.

A LAW TO AMEND THE DEPARTURE FROM THE COLONY OF NATIVES OF THE COLONY (REGULATION) LAW, 1938.

BE it enacted by His Excellency the Governor and Commander-in-Chief of the Colony of Cyprus as follows:—

1. This Law may be cited as the Departure from the Colony of Natives of the Colony (Regulation) (Amendment) Law, 1940, and shall be read as one with the Departure from the Colony of Natives of the Colony (Regulation) Law, 1938, (hereinafter called "the Principal Law"), and the Principal Law and this Law may together be cited as the Departure from the Colony of Natives of the Colony (Regulation) Laws, 1938 and 1940.
