**THE STATUTE LAWS OF CYPRUS**

**No. 18 OF 1940.**

A LAW TO PROVIDE FOR THE TIME IN THE COLONY  
BEING THREE HOURS IN ADVANCE OF GREENWICH  
MEAN TIME DURING A CERTAIN PERIOD  
OF THE YEAR.

**B**E it enacted by His Excellency the Governor and  
Commander-in-Chief of the Colony of Cyprus as  
follows:—

1. This Law may be cited as the Summer Time Short title.

2.—(1) During such period in each year as the Governor may by order prescribe, the time for legal and general purposes in the Colony shall be three hours in advance of Greenwich Mean Time.

(2) Whenever any expression of time occurs in any law, Order in Council, order, regulation, rule, proclamation, bye-law, or any like instrument, or in any deed, time table, notice, advertisement, or other document, the time mentioned or referred to shall be held, during the prescribed period, to be the time as fixed by this Law:

Provided always that nothing in this Law shall affect the use of Greenwich Mean Time or Eastern European Time for purposes of astronomy, meteorology, or navigation, or shall affect the construction of any document mentioning or referring to time in connection with such purposes as aforesaid.
