A LAW TO AMEND THE RURAL CONSTABLES LAWS, 1932  
TO 1942.

**B**E it enacted by His Excellency the Governor and  
Commander-in-Chief of the Colony of Cyprus as  
follows :—

1. This Law may be cited as the Rural Constables  
(Amendment) Law, 1943, and shall be read as one with the  
Rural Constables Laws, 1932 to 1942, (hereinafter referred  
to as “ the principal Law ”), and the principal Law and  
this Law may together be cited as the Rural Constables  
Laws, 1932 to 1943.

2. The principal Law is hereby amended by the insertion therein immediately after section 13 of the following section :—

“ Appoint-  
ment of  
special rural  
constables  
in towns.

13A.—(1) Notwithstanding anything in this Law contained any owner or owners of landed property in any town may, with the approval of the Commissioner of the District in which such property is situated, appoint a special rural constable for the purposes of such property.

Notification  
of appoint-  
ment.

(2) Every appointment of a special constable under this section shall be notified as soon as possible by the owner or owners of the property to the Commissioner of the District, the Superintendent and the Mukhtar of the quarter of the town within which the property is situated.

Salary

(3) The salary of any special rural constable appointed under this section shall be paid by the owner or owners of the property.

Dismissal.

(4) Any special rural constable appointed under this section shall be liable to be dismissed by the owner or owners appointing him and such owner or owners shall notify such dismissal as soon as possible to the Commissioner of the District, the Superintendent and the Mukhtar of the quarter of the town within which the property is situated.

Provisions of  
this Law to  
apply.

(5) Save as provided in sub-sections (3) and (4) of this section or as specifically provided in any other section of this Law, every special rural constable appointed under this section shall be liable and subject to all the other provisions of this Law relating to rural constables.

Notice by  
nominee of  
owners.

(6) Where several owners of landed property appoint a special rural constable for the purposes of their property, they may nominate one of them to give, on their behalf, any notice required to be given under the provisions of this section.”
