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**THE STATUTE LAWS OF CYPRUS**

**No. 35 OF 1944.**

**A LAW TO IMPOSE A SPECIAL DUTY IN RESPECT OF CERTAIN  
DOCUMENTS.**

**B**E it enacted by His Excellency the Officer Administering the Government and Commander-in-Chief of the Colony of Cyprus as follows:—

**1.** This Law may be cited as the Documents (Special Short title, Duty) Law, 1944.

Interpre-  
tation.

2. In this Law—

“appropriate authority” means the authority established by, or appointed under, or mentioned in, any Law or public instrument enumerated in column 2 of the Schedule hereto, having power to deal with any document described in column 3 of the Schedule hereto.

Special duty  
to be charged  
and paid.

3. Whenever any document described in column 3 of the Schedule hereto—

- (a) is made or delivered ; or
- (b) is issued by the appropriate authority ; or
- (c) is sent to or left with the appropriate authority,

under the provisions of any Law or public instrument enumerated in column 2 of the Schedule hereto, there shall be paid to the appropriate authority, in respect of every such document, a special duty at the rate appearing in column 4 of the said Schedule and set opposite to the description of such document.

Special duty  
to be paid  
by adhesive  
stamps.

4. The special duty imposed by this Law shall be paid by adhesive stamps of a value equal to the rate appearing in column 4 of the Schedule hereto, and such adhesive stamps shall be affixed as follows, that is to say,—

- (a) where the document is issued by the appropriate authority out of a counterfoil book, on the counterfoil of such book ; and
- (b) in all other cases, on the document itself.

5. The special duty imposed by this Law in respect of any document described in column 3 of the Schedule hereto, shall be in addition to any other fee, charge or duty payable in respect of any such document under the provisions of any other Law or public instrument in force for the time being.

6. The Documents (Special Duty) Law, 1940, is hereby repealed.

7. Nothing in this Law shall apply to or affect any special duty paid under the Documents (Special Duty) Law, 1940.
