# THE STATUTE LAWS OF CYPRUS

No. 35 OF 1953.

A LAW TO AMEND THE CINEMATOGRAPH FILMS LAW. CAP. 61.

**B**E it enacted by His Excellency the Governor and Commander-in-Chief of the Colony of Cyprus as follows :—

**1.** This Law may be cited as the Cinematograph Films Short title.  
(Amendment) Law, 1953, and shall be read as one with the  
Cinematograph Films Law (hereinafter referred to as "the Cap. 61.  
principal Law").

Amendment of section 3 of the principal Law.

2. Sub-section (1) of section 3 of the principal Law is hereby amended by the deletion therefrom of the words “, not being less than nine and not more than twelve,” (lines 2 and 3).

Amendment of section 8 of the principal Law.

3. Sub-section (2) of section 8 of the principal Law is hereby amended by the substitution for the word “shall” (line 3) of the word “may”.

Repeal of section 13 of the principal Law and substitution of new section.

4. Section 13 of the principal Law is hereby repealed and the following section substituted therefor:—

“Regulations.

13. The Governor-in-Council may make Regulations for carrying into effect the purposes of this Law and, without prejudice to the generality of the power so conferred, in particular for—

- (a) prescribing the fees to be paid for any matter or thing to be done under this Law or any Regulations made hereunder;
- (b) prescribing the forms to be used for any matter or thing to be done under this Law or any Regulations made hereunder;
- (c) prescribing the conditions and the procedure with respect to the submission of films or posters for approval and to the grant of such approval and the terms, conditions and restrictions thereof or relating thereto;
- (d) exempting from censorship any kind or class of advertising matter;
- (e) prescribing any other matter required to be prescribed under the provisions of this Law;
- (f) providing for the imposition of penalties not exceeding fifty pounds fine for any contravention of, or failure to comply with, any of the Regulations made hereunder or decision taken under such Regulations and for forfeiture of any film or poster in respect of which the contravention or failure has been made.”
