BE it enacted by His Excellency the Governor and Commander-in-Chief of the Colony of Cyprus as follows :—

1. This Law may be cited as the Customs Tariff (Amendment No. 2) Law, 1957, and shall be read as one with the Customs Tariff Laws, 1954 to 1957 (hereinafter referred to as "the principal Law"), and the principal Law and this Law may together be cited as the Customs Tariff Laws, 1954 to (No. 2) 1957.
