- Short title. 1. This Law may be cited as the Fish Preservation Law.
- Interpretation. 2. In this Law—
 “ fish ” means all kinds of fish and includes eels.
- Taking fish without licence unlawful in certain localities. 3. No person shall by any means whatever kill, capture or pursue or aid in killing, capturing or pursuing any fish in any of the reservoirs, channels, drains and other waters connected with the public irrigation works in the District of Famagusta without the written permission of the Director of Water Development.
- Penalty. 4. Any person acting in contravention of the provisions of this Law shall be guilty of an offence under this Law and shall be liable upon summary conviction before a Court of Magisterial jurisdiction to a fine not exceeding one pound or in default of payment thereof to a period of imprisonment not exceeding one week.
